

OAHC programs provide facts and skills to avoid risk behaviors such as non-marital sexual activity, alcohol and other drug use, violence – including but not limited to bullying, dating violence, human trafficking, and suicide awareness which meet the requirements of several laws.

Ohio Adolescent Health Centers Inc. (OAHC) is a collaborative of risk avoidance educators who provide programming in 78% of Ohio's 88 counties. OAHC offers 5-10 sessions of risk avoidance education programming for grades five through high school each school year. A student completing all grade levels receives almost 50 sessions of risk avoidance education assisting public and private schools in meeting several federal and state laws.



Male, 8th Grade, Cuyahoga Co. – "This program will help me set my boundaries and respect boundaries of others."


OAHC's most recent evaluation by Social Capital Valuations revealed that OAHC is very successful in reducing teen pregnancies and increasing the number of teens who have <u>not</u> had sex during their teen years.

This graph represents those choosing to participate in sexual activity.

While the intervention group's response held steady at 15% over all 3 waves, the control group's results continued to increase over time, peaking at 24% at wave 3. The 9-point differential at wave 3 represents a 64% (9/14) increase in sexual initiation for the control group compared against the intervention group. This equates to a 35% success rate.

OAHC Programs

- Meet the Medical Institute's K-12 Standards for Optimal Sexual Development.
- Are approved by the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Sexual Risk Avoidance Program.
- Are funded through state and federal grants from ODH and the Ohio Department of Education (ODE).



Over a half-a-million students (515,818) received risk avoidance instruction from Ohio Adolescent Health Centers (OAHC) from 2016-2023. Equipping students with this information literally saves the State of Ohio millions of dollars (as seen below) in students acquiring knowledge and skills on how and why to avoid early pregnancies, sexually transmitted diseases, violence, addictions, and prison. The students served varies depending on the amount of funding received each year. OAHC has the ability to double the number of students served depending on funding. Students receive five to ten sessions of classroom programming as scheduled by each school. Curricula used are evidence based, medically accurate, and well received by youth, their schools, and their parents. All curricula meet the state and federal laws for risk avoidance and healthy relationship requirements.

The total four-year investment (2016-2020) in the OAHC Project was **\$9,933,286**. When we divide \$185,087,706 by \$9,933,286, we see that **\$18.63 is returned for every \$1.00 invested in the OAHC Project.** Note: Calculated by Social Capital Valuations, Reston, VA.
